

Igniting the Spark

Opera is much more than the sound of music. It's a powerful educational tool, drawing on all aspects of human experience and infusing them with passion. Because it incorporates drama, music, design, history, culture, language and literature, Opera not only broadens conceptualization skills, but it also educates the whole child.

San Francisco Opera Guild's programs aim to foster the imagination, cultural understanding and abstract thinking, as well as nurture a lifelong passion for the arts. A talented and accomplished faculty works together to bring opera to life in the classroom and community in an exciting and innovative manner.

For elementary students, San Francisco Opera Guild makes operatic classics come alive with our Sing a Story and Opera à la Carte programs. Through Book to Bravo, the composer/librettist hats go on and students write and perform a short opera based on the classroom curriculum. Older students are able to explore their social and political sides through an artistic lens with Voices for Social Justice and Creative Opera Workshop.

Beyond the classroom, students of all ages can enjoy Student Dress Rehearsals at San Francisco Opera, as well as our wildly popular summer program now in its sixth year, the Summer Training Conservatory. The Guild also recently performed "How Andy Found His Voice," an anti-bullying piece showcasing gems from our classic opera repertoire, to nearly 3,000 students.

We also offer programs for adults, including informal panel discussions in which renowned artists and experts from the opera world share their insights and experiences. The opera experience becomes much more meaningful in the popular Opera Guild Preview Lectures, as distinguished musicologists guide and intrigue participants with details about the opera's story, its meaning, history, cultural influence and the composer's inspiration.



- [Sing a Story](#) regularly reaches 250 classrooms and 6,000+ students in the Bay Area, bringing to life classic stories such as: "The Magic Flute," "Das Rheingold" and "Hansel and Gretel."
- [Opera à la Carte](#) (Grades 3-8) reaches more than 120 schools and 42,000 students.
- [Book to Bravo](#) has helped students create almost 30 curriculum-based original operas reaching more than 2,500 students.
- [Student Dress Rehearsals](#) allow 2,200-plus students in grades 4-12 to see fully staged dress rehearsals of main-stage San Francisco Opera productions.
- [Voices for Social Justice](#) works with 30+ students, helping them to express their cultural viewpoints in music, in this pilot program.
- [Summer Conservatory](#) brings stellar training and performance opportunity to its students through three weeks of intense opera arts study.

Education Program Sponsorships

CONTRIBUTION	IMPACT: WHAT YOUR CONTRIBUTION GIVES STUDENTS
\$2,000	<p>Sing a Story in 11 classrooms</p> <p>Our award-winning classroom program for Grades K-3 features a teaching artist introducing a classic opera story, complete with singing, costumes and opera facts in an interactive class model.</p>
\$7,000	<p>Creative Opera Workshop for five classrooms</p> <p>Teaching artists collaborate with teachers, making curricular connections to an opera that is being offered as a student dress rehearsal.</p>
\$10,000	<p>Ten student scholarships to the Summer Conservatory</p> <p>Students, aged 10-17, are trained in opera, theater, musical theater and dance. The 15 day-program culminates in a group performance.</p>
\$15,000	<p>Opera à la Carte programs for 15 schools</p> <p>This in-school program for Grades 3-8 uses Guild support material and costumes, while teachers prepare their students to work with opera singers in a stage production for their peers.</p>
\$25,000	<p>Voices for Social Justice program for 10 schools</p> <p>A year-long residency during which our teaching artists team up with teachers to introduce how song has been an instrumental element in shaping societal change and, closer to home, how music can be a non-violent force in conflict resolution in the school, neighborhood and city.</p>




15 Things Kids Can Learn from Studying the Arts


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
