Taking place in Herbst Theatre on Friday, November 15, *The Future Is Now* features the 2024 Adler Fellows: sopranos **Georgiana Adams**, **Caroline Corrales**, **Arianna Rodriguez**

and Olivia Smith; mezzo-soprano Nikola Printz; tenor Thomas Kinch; baritone Samuel Kidd; bass-baritones Jongwon Han and James McCarthy; and pianists Julian Grabarek and Yang Lin. Accompanied by the San Francisco Opera Orchestra under the baton of Benjamin Manis, who makes his San Francisco Opera debut leading Bizet's *Carmen* (opening November 13), the Adlers will perform scenes and arias from operatic works, including classics by Mozart, Handel and Verdi and an excerpt from Kevin Puts' *The Hours*.
