SAN FRANCISCO, CA (August 24, 2026) — The opening weekend of San Francisco Opera's 104th season concludes on Sunday, September 13 with the Company's presentation of *Opera in the Park*. This popular and free event presented by the *San Francisco Chronicle* features Caroline H. Hume Music Director Eun Sun Kim conducting the San Francisco Opera Orchestra and stars of the Company's fall season at Robin Williams Meadow in Golden Gate Park.

This year marks Diane B. Wilsey's 20th as the Opera's Opening Weekend Grand Sponsor, making possible the season-opening *Opera Ball* benefit and opening night performance of *Simon Boccanegra* on September 12 along with *Opera in the Park* on September 13.

Classical California is the radio sponsor for the 51st *Opera in the Park*, and on-air hosts Dianne Nicolini, Maggie Clennon Reberg and Jennifer Miller Hammel will welcome the audience. San

Francisco Opera's Tad and Dianne Taube General Director **Matthew Shilvock** will emcee the event. From the casts of the first two operas of the 2026–27 Season—Giuseppe Verdi's *Simon Boccanegra* and Thea Musgrave's *Mary, Queen of Scots*—*Opera in the Park* soloists scheduled to appear include sopranos Eleonora Buratto, Sofia Gotch, Mary Hoskins, Toni Marie Palmertree and Heidi Stober; tenors Joshua Guerrero and Christopher Sokolowski; baritones Amartuvshin Enkhbat, Thomas Mole and Gabriel Natal-Báez; and bass-baritone Christian Van Horn. The program of arias and ensembles highlights works by Leoncavallo, Donizetti, Puccini, Richard Strauss, Verdi, Glinka and Weber, among others, as well as a movie musical favorite.

## ABOUT OPERA IN THE PARK

Established by former San Francisco Opera General Director Kurt Herbert Adler in 1971, *Opera in the Park* celebrates the opening of the Company's season with a free outdoor concert. The annual event now typically draws more than 10,000 to San Francisco's idyllic Golden Gate Park for an afternoon of arias, duets and popular song. Many operatic luminaries have performed at *Opera in the Park*, including Montserrat Caballé, Marilyn Horne and Renata Scottò. Luciano Pavarotti appeared at *Opera in the Park* on three occasions, beginning in 1973 with soprano Licia Albanese for the series' second event, a concert to honor the memory of Company founder Gaetano Merola. When the Music Concourse and bandshell sustained damage after the 1998 earthquake, the concerts were moved to Sharon Meadow, later renamed Robin Williams Meadow in 2018.

San Francisco Opera celebrates 51 years of *Opera in the Park*, the free, annual concert in San Francisco's Golden Gate Park, marking the new opera season. Presented by the *San Francisco Chronicle*, *Opera in the Park* draws more than 10,000 to Robin Williams Meadow each season to hear the San Francisco Opera Orchestra and stars of the new season in an all-fresco program of arias and songs.

Back by popular demand, a contest will be held to crown the most outstanding picnic spread with judges roaming the grounds during the first half of the concert, looking for the most over-the-top display to be awarded the grand prize. Food and beverages will also be available for purchase at the park. Attendees are encouraged to bring refillable water bottles and make use of the water stations positioned around Robin Williams Meadow.

This event is FREE; no tickets are required. Senior/accessible seating and ADA parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis. Public parking is extremely limited and alternative transportation, such as Muni (5, 7, 21, 33, N) and ridesharing apps are strongly recommended. Complimentary bicycle valet parking area is provided by Bike East Bay on the east side of the meadow.
